OREGON ASSEMBLY FOR BLACK AFFAIRS

The Oregon Assembly For Black Affairs (OABA) is a nonprofit statewide corporation committed to improving the status of Blacks in Oregon. It was founded on April 9, 1977, and is registered with the Oregon Corporation Division. Although non-partisan, the organization is political and emphasizes building a better Oregon for the Black Community.

MEMBERSHIP

Any person who is in accord with the principles and policies of Oregon Assembly For Black Affairs may become a member upon consent of the Board of Directors, by accepting the terms of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Oregon Assembly For Black Affairs and by paving annually. in advance, the requisite membership fee.

Membership dues are per vear, renewable on the anniversary date of the member's approval and acceptance. Basic membership dues are \$25 per year. Information on dues for other membership categories is available on the application.

ACTIVITIES

Oregon Assembly For Black Affairs is headquartered in the state capital, Salem. The Board of Directors of OABA meets monthly, usually in Salem, to handle the on-going business of the corporation. Membership meetings are held quarterly. The OABA Board of Directors has determined that as a statewide organization, membership meetings should be held in Black population centers around the state. Currently, the March meeting is held in Eugene; the June meeting is held in Corvallis and the September meeting is held in Portland. Meeting locations may change over time. The Annual Meeting is held each December in Salem. During the Annual Meeting we assess the prior year's accomplishments, identify priorities for the coming year and elect officers (even years) or committee chairpersons (odd

Throughout the year, OABA focuses on educating the Black Community and the public, about Assembly goals and objectives, works with public and private institutions and media to improve the images presented of Blacks in Oregon, directs efforts toward increasing membership and plans political conventions and economic summits.

This work takes place through committee activities and quarterly meetings of the membership. Periodic communication with the membership takes place through mailings.

OABA works with other organizations serving the needs of Blacks in Oregon, in building a better Oregon for the Black Community. The Assembly seeks neither to replace nor undermine existing organizations that are working to achieve similar goals.

OBJECTIVES


- Support and promote the development of competitive, quality Black businesses, whenever and wherever economically feasible.
